



Petishes are small objects that depict animals or icons that are important in several North American indigenous cultures. They are carved in stone, precious gems, coral, shells and other materials. North American Indians believe that fetishes have magical powers and give people protection at different moments in life. Nowadays, these

hand-carved figures are considered to be pieces of artwork. Among the different fetishes made by various indigenous peoples, the ones created by the Zuni people are the most admired.

The Zuni tribe lives in New Mexico, in the United States, where they keep a set of traditional customs — and carving fetishes is one of them. They make fetishes of animals whose characteristics are important to them.

Mountain lion – Seen as having leadership skills and as being resourceful and powerful.

Bear – Associated with strength, introspection and self-knowledge. Also seen as the great protector and healer.

Coyote – Respected for its survival skills and related to humor and the ability to laugh at oneself.



Badger – Although seen as aggressive, perseverance is the main characteristic of this animal according to the Zuni people.



Eagle – Known for its creativity, intuition and great vision. Also seen as a healer.

Mole – Considered protector of crops and the underground. The Zuni people see it as a symbol of introspection and awareness.

Wolf – Since this animal always lives in packs, it's seen as an example of loyalty and wisdom and an advocate of family values.





# Five Tips to Ace Your Volunteer Work Interview

 ${
m A}$  tips to help you have a successful interview. Tip #1: Learn about the organization. Find as much information as possible about the institution you want to volunteer for. The interviewer won't test you on this kind of information, but you can use your research to show you are really interested in the institution. Tip #2: . If you don't know exactly what tasks the position involves, don't be afraid to ask the recruiter! But do it before the interview. Tip #3: . Forget clothes that are too casual: the way you dress for an interview shows how seriously you are going to take the volunteer work. For teen boys, a nice pair of pants and a shirt will do, but if you really want

to impress, add a tie to the outfit. Teen girls should not wear too much make up or jewelry. Tip #4: Be on time. Being late for an interview is unacceptable. Carefully plan your journey to the place where the interview will happen. Will someone take you? Will you use public transportation? How is the traffic in the area? . It's pretty easy to get sidetracked when answering questions. Or you might be too nervous and end up giving monosyllabic answers, or speaking too much. Take a deep breath to calm down and concentrate on the interviewer. He/she understands that you are nervous-he/she has been in your shoes! If you need more advice, talk to your parents, older siblings or to your teacher! They will be more than happy to help you!
