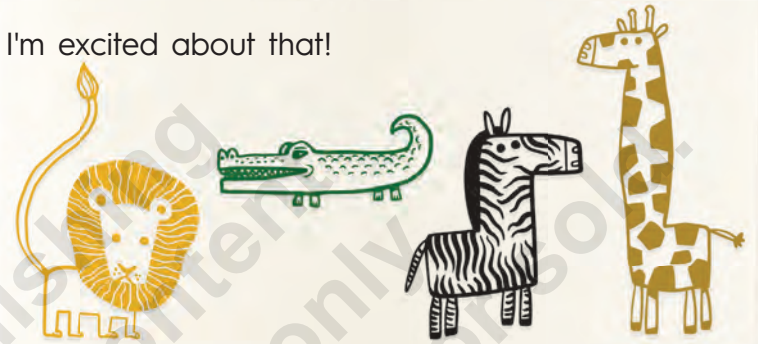

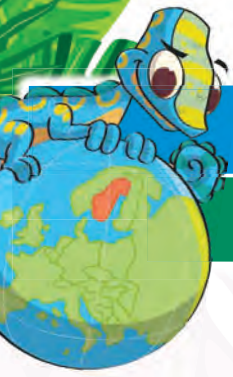

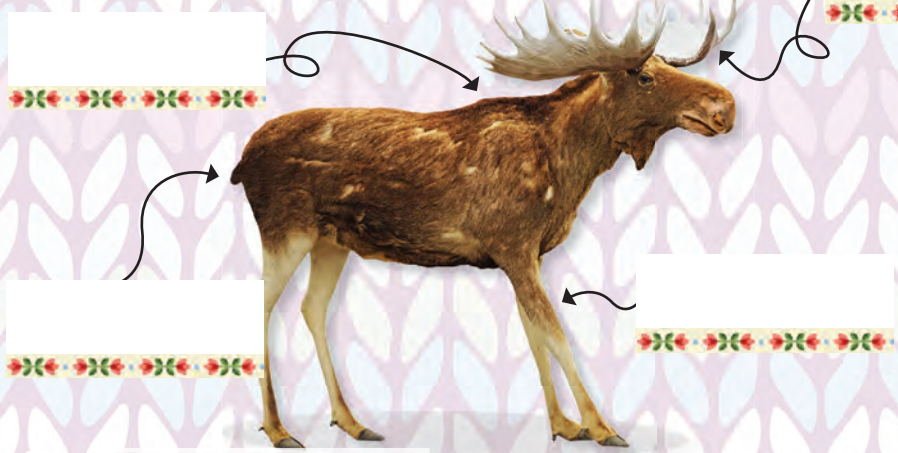

Art in the Stockholm Subway Stations

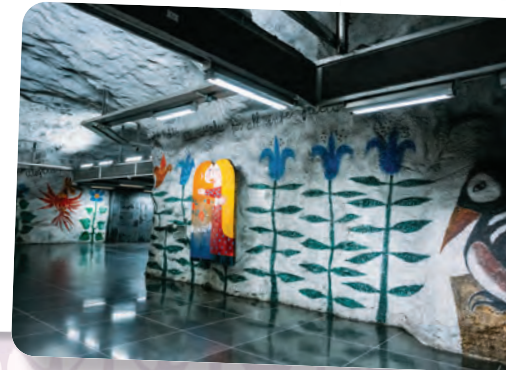
The subway system is over 110 kilometers long. Traveling by subway is like traveling through an exciting story that extends from the artistic pioneers of the 1950s to the art experiments of today.



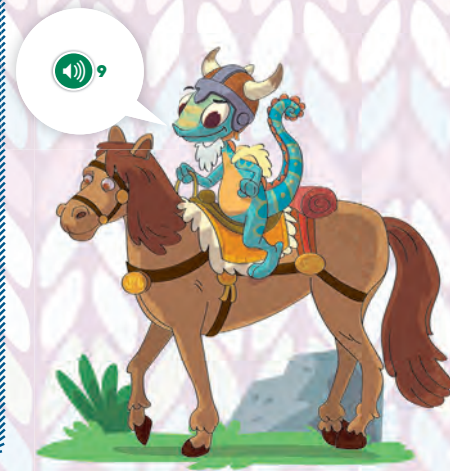
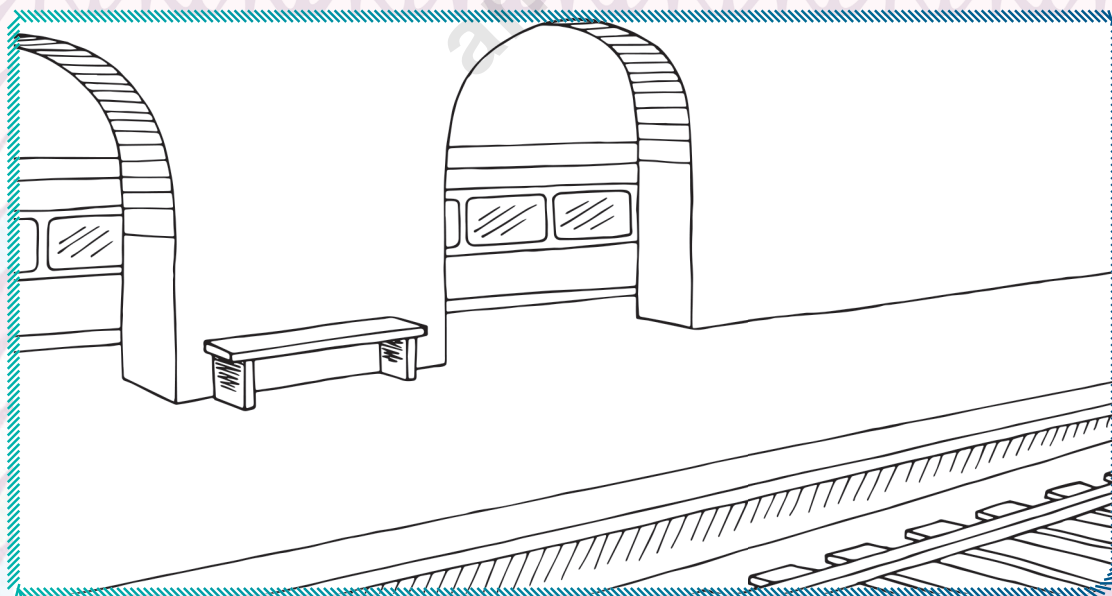
Stockholm is a city that has one of the coolest public transportation systems: the subway. Other cities around the world have subway systems, so why

is Stockholm's subway different? When you walk into a Stockholm subway station, it is like entering the world's longest art exhibition.

About 90 of the 100 stations have been decorated by over 150 artists with different themes and various forms. These include mosaics, paintings, installations, sculptures and more. You can cover the entire Stockholm subway art tour itinerary in just two hours.



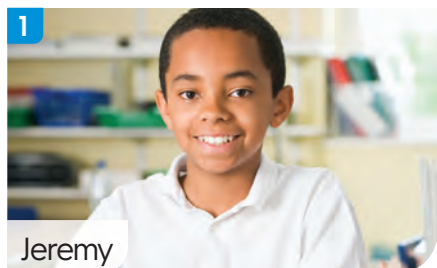

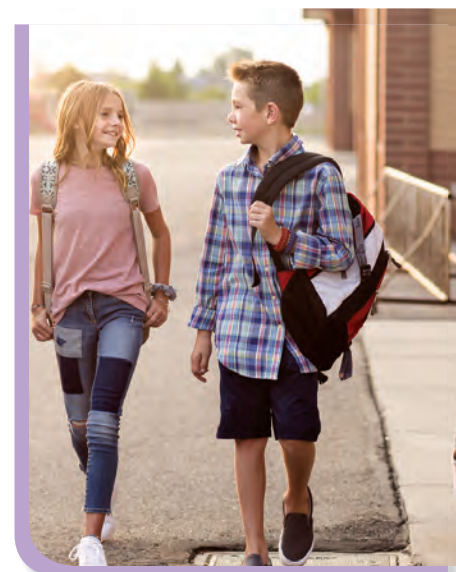


