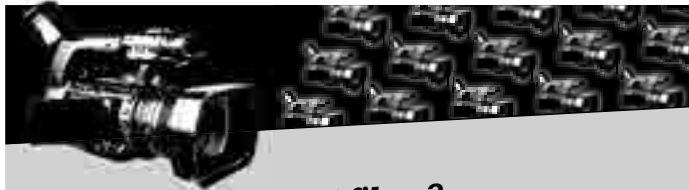

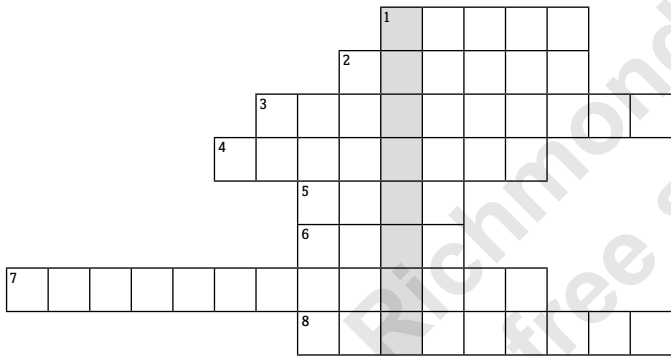

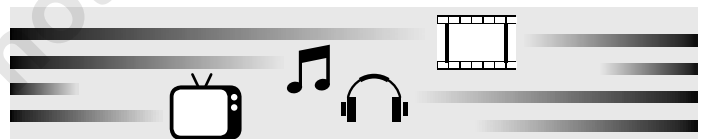

We use exclamation marks to show that we feel strongly about something in an informal piece of writing, e.g.

... we don't sleep much!

And to show our opinion about something, e.g.

I think it's horrible!

Remember! We don't use exclamation marks in formal writing. We don't use exclamation marks at the end of every sentence. We only use one exclamation mark at the end of a sentence.

We use *like/love/enjoy + -ing* to talk about things we like or enjoy, e.g.

I like hanging out with my friends and we love having sleepovers.

I enjoy playing games online ...

We use *but* to join two different ideas, e.g.

My brother listens to rap music, but I can't stand it.

We use *so* to give a reason for something, e.g.

I'm into skateboarding, so I go to the park every weekend.

We use *I think ...* to give our opinion about something, e.g.

I think it's horrible!
