Publish it yourself

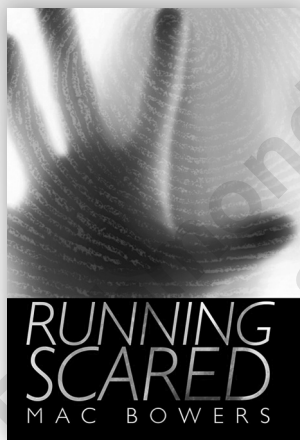
With easier access to technology, more and more people are publishing their own books and 'self-publishing' is becoming popular with people of all ages, including teenagers.

Mac Bowers lives in Pennsylvania with her father, her brother and sister and her two dogs. Like any other teenager, she goes to school during the day but at nights and in her spare time she writes books. Her dad suggested that Mac publish her book. He gave her some money to help her and he's very proud of her achievements.

Published in 2012, Mac's first book is called *Running Scared* and critics of all ages have praised it. It tells the story of a sixteen-year-old American girl called Morgan Casey. Morgan moves from a big city in California to live in a very small community in Pennsylvania. Morgan knows she needs to make new friends but she is worried about something. Morgan has a secret that she doesn't want to share with anyone.

On her first day at her new high school Morgan meets Charlie. Charlie is a lively, talkative and friendly boy and they soon become good friends. Charlie talks to Morgan a lot and eventually she tells Charlie her secret in the hope that he can help her escape her past. However, she regrets it immediately. It's a tense story that keeps you guessing to the very end.

Are you feeling inspired? Do you think you can write a good story? If so, we recommend that you try self-publishing, we can vouch for it! But remember ... you'll probably need some money!

Micro libraries

A few years ago in the small village of Westbury-sub-Mendip in the south of England the mobile library stopped coming. For the local people, borrowing books became difficult since the nearest library was about six and a half kilometres away. At the same time, the traditional red public phone box in the village was about to be sold. However, one of the villagers came up with an unusual way to solve both problems: a village committee bought the phone box for £1, adapted it and turned it into a library.

The library has four shelves and local residents donate their own books. The principle is simple: bring a book to the library that you've read, leave it for someone else to read and borrow a book you haven't read. There's even a children's section: a small red plastic box on the phone box floor! It's open all year round, 24 hours a day.

The library has become a popular place with everyone in the village but it's been particularly good for the older residents because some of them have found it difficult to make the journey to the nearest library. When they've finished the book they're reading, they just walk down the road and have a look. There's always something new and interesting that someone's just left. They have to be



quick though because the good titles have usually gone within minutes!

There is a very fast turnover of books and the stock is constantly changing. The library has a wide range of genres suitable for everyone: biographies, crime novels, reference books. A local couple cleans the library and someone checks the stock on a regular basis. If books have stayed on the shelves for more than a few weeks, then they usually go to a local charity shop.

The UK is not the only place where micro libraries are popular. In the USA, Todd Bol set up the *The Little Free Library* after his mother died. She was a teacher and she loved books and was always keen to encourage other people to read more.

In honour of his mother, Todd built a small waterproof box at the end of his drive and put books in it for people to borrow and to leave a book of their own. His simple idea has now grown into an international community-based book project and it has developed in 36 different countries. There are now about 5 or 6,000 *Little Free Libraries* around the world which means that people have borrowed about 1,650,000 books since the scheme began in 2010.

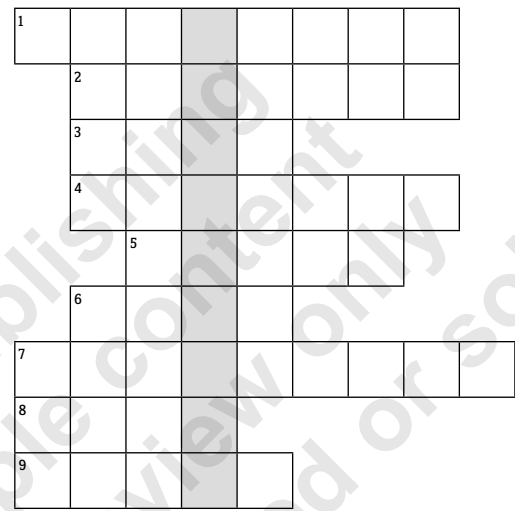
